1. AAC Also Can

Funding Goal To promote increased use of AAC in community settings and greater societal support for AAC users and their families, the AAC Also Can

is a platform for persons who use AAC to meet other persons who use AAC. Through online and in-person meet ups, this is a space for persons

subcommittee will organize two types of events: Smaller scale (online / in person) Bigger event / Summer camp

Details of each are provided below:

1. Smaller scale events: These events will take place in-person or online

Smaller scale events will be conducted 2 times each year (Feb/ March and Nov/ Dec).

Each of these events will target a maximum of 10 AAC users, and 10 Communication partners, supported by 6-8 volunteers/ community members.

This event will take place in-person The bigger event will be conducted 1 time each year (June/July).

2. Bigger event (Summer camp)

2. AAC Can Share

is a group that focuses on sharing information, resources, and support related to AAC, to enhance communication and participation for individuals with complex communication needs. This may include training, workshops, and advocacy efforts to promote the use of AAC in Singapore.

Funding Goal



AAC Can Share was first launched in 2020 and relaunched in 2023. Since then, it has run five inclusive, peer-driven learning events under the

(including AAC users), cover venue and technology costs, and expand opportunities for hands-on learning with AAC systems. Our approach is grounded in lived experience and community feedback, with strong volunteer retention from past sessions. This model of collective learning is unique in Singapore, where AAC training remains mostly professional-led and classroom-based. 3. Pilot Project Funding Goal (no name for this pilot yet)


This budget would be set aside to hire a professional who would be able to teach/guide the PWUAAC.

Target of \$3k for us to start running a pilot project where we support our post-18 community of PWUAAC to improve vocabulary and semantics.


